Life Reflections

Laura La Verne Gray Brown was born in Washington, D.C. on June 23, 1927, and died December 30, 2019. Laura was 92 years old. She was born to the late Thornton Hoard Gray and Leona Shaw Gray.

Laura married her college sweetheart, George W.C. Brown, Jr. of 62 years. They were always seen together enjoying each other's company. They had two children, the late George W.C. Brown, III of Norfolk, Virginia and Laura Brown Mabry of St. Louis, Missouri (Rickey T. Mabry) and two grandsons, Dorian A. Mabry (Ja'Lessa) also with a great grandson on the way and Terrance C. Mabry of Kansas City, Missouri.

Laura was baptized, confirmed and married at Calvary Episcopal Church located in Washington, D.C. She graduated from Dunbar High School in Washington, D.C. and from Miner Teachers College in Washington, D.C. Laura taught briefly in Schenectady, New York, where she was the first "Black" teacher; She also taught in Pittsfield, Massachusetts and in Norfolk, Virginia.

She was a member of Grace Episcopal Church of Norfolk, Virginia, where she and her family attended for 60 years. After her husband and son passed, Laura moved to St. Louis, Missouri with her daughter and her family, where she joined All Saints Ascension Episcopal Church. Laura shared her family life with a variety of groups. These groups included: St. Doretha's Guild, Sunday School teacher, Daughter's of the King and Episcopal Church Women Grace Episcopal Church. She was also a member of Episcopal Church Women of All Saints Ascension. Laura was a Life member of the National Association of the Advancement of Colored People; Women's Club of Norfolk; Trustee at Westminster Canterbury, Virginia Beach, Virginia and Trustee at Ballentine House Norfolk, Virginia.

Laura was dedicated to her Sorority - Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. As a life-long Golden Soror in Iota Omega, Norfolk, Virginia. She served in many capacities. After moving to St Louis, she became active with Omicron Theta Omega. She was a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha, Inc. for 74 years.

Laura is also survived by: her sister-in-law ~ Yvette Brown Ridley, (wife of the late Isaac Ridley) of Jacksonville, Florida; the late Ruth Brown Blair, wife of the late Garnett Blair of Richmond, Virginia. Laura has several nieces, nephews, and god children that she also loved dearly. All of Laura's siblings preceded her in death, Evelyn Gray Lyles; Leona Gray Huguley and Richard Thornton Gray. Left to share a lifetime of memories are: her family, extended family, Church family and Sorority sisters.
