

Life Reflections

Mosie Lee professed her faith as a child and was baptized in her family Baptist Church in Blytheville, Arkansas. She relocated to St. Louis, Missouri. She enjoyed church fellowship activities, cooking Sunday dinner for her family and all family gatherings. Mosie Lee preferred listening to the Cardinals baseball games on the radio and she also enjoyed reading the newspaper. Mosie Lee also loved returning home to Arkansas to visit her family.

Mosie Lee was very strong in her faith. She transitioned from her life on earth to her eternal life on Thursday, December 26, 2019 at the age of 89.
