Obituary for Virgil and Maria Lucas

Virgil H. Lucas Jr. and Maria Luella Lucas, (father and daughter) both moved pass this life on Mondays, one week and one hour apart. Virgil's wife and Maria's mother, Warlita Lucas, passed away on August 18, 2019 after a devastating fight with cancer. Maria had remained the consonant caregiver for both her parents during their long debilitating illnesses. Virgil often lovingly talked about how lucky he was to have Maria for a caregiver. Then suddenly on the evening of Monday, February 24, an evil, senseless act of gun violence ended her life. It is tragic that two members of the same family have passed away within a week.

Born October 15, 1941, Virgil Lucas Jr., was the eldest of three children, born to Attorney Virgil H. Lucas Sr. and Luella McIntyre Lucas. In 1948 the Lucas family left St. Louis, and moved to Los Angeles, CA. where he and his brother Robert, started elementary school, during that time they were also joined by a younger sister, Katherine. In 1955, Virgil Sr. moved the family back to St. Louis to reestablish his law practice.

Virgil graduated from Sumner High School in 1958. he next attended Harris Stowe State University, (previously Harris State Teachers College). In 1960 he decided to join his brother Robert, in Los Angeles, California and worked in the restaurant and sales industry. He returned to St. Louis a couple of years later and worked for the US Postal Service.

In 1964, Virgil enlisted in the United States Air Force (USAF). During a tour of duty in the Philippines' he meant and married Warlita Biscuit Lucas in 1971 from that marriage created a family of three children; Rudy (Biscuit) Lucas, Virgil Lucas III, and Maria Luella Lucas. He attended College while in the service and achieved an undergraduate degree of Economics and Business and an MBA. He pledged with and became active with Kappa Alpha Phi Fraternity.

During the years he reunited and developed a loving relationship with his son from a previous relationship Christopher Henderson.

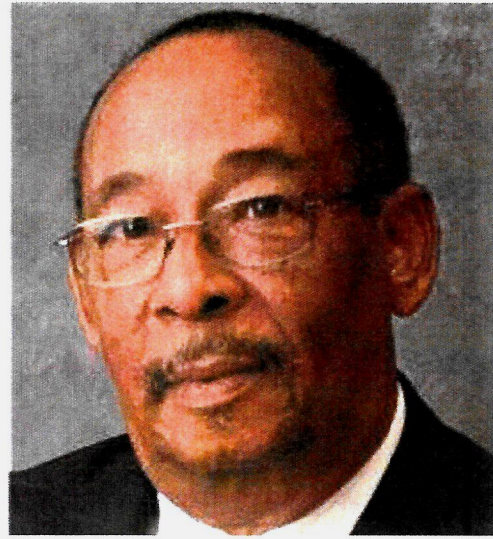
After twenty years in the service and completing several tours of duty including two in Viet Nam, he retired as Captain Virgil H Lucas. He next worked as supervisor of Business Mail at the main post office; later retiring to his next career as a successful real estate broker. He was a man with a distinct sense of style, a big heart and everlasting taste for adventure.

Maria Lucas was born on July 3, 1974 to Virgil Lucas Jr. and Warlita Lucas at Whiteman Air Force Base at Knobnoster, Missouri. She graduated from Ladue Horton Watkins High School in 1992, then attended Fontbonne College. During college Maria pledged and was actively involved with the undergraduate chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority.

As an amendment to her technical education, Maria decided to participate in ITT Tech's web design program.

Maria reserved a space in her heart for those in need and started her career by working with Special Education, she worked for the Ritnuer School District. Maria frequently worked as a camp counselor in the summer months for the YMCA. She eventually began working as a supervisor at the Maryland Heights Community Center (MHCC) again serving the community she loved Maria could light up a room with her smile and could often be found lost in a good book or watching movies with her family.

Virgil and Maria are survived by a son/brother, Virgil Lucas III(Theresa), a son/brother Rudy Lucas(Beth), a son/brother Christopher Henderson(Reba),an Uncle Robert Lucas, an Aunt Katherine Lucas, Johnson; grandchildren/nieces/nephews, Hannah, Genevie, Xayvion, Kahairi, Nathan and a host of nieces/nephews/cousins

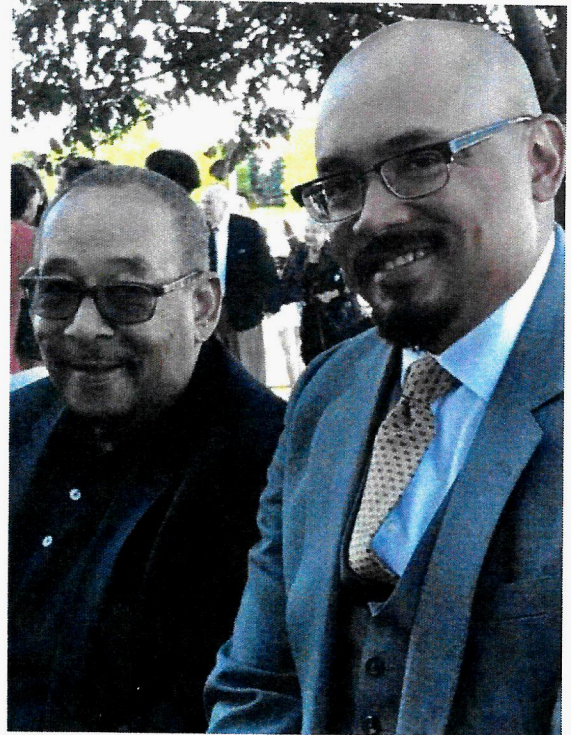
