Louise Penney McElroy



Louise Doyle Penney was born on July 14, 1925 in St. Louis, Missouri. She was the daughter of Joseph Doyle Penney and Mary Louise Penney. Her mother a homemaker, and childhood friend of Rosa Parks, was originally from Birmingham and was among the first African-American registered nurses in the State of Alabama. Her father attended Tuskegee Institute and later became a trusted friend and advisor to A. Phillip Randolph during railroad organizing efforts.

Louise was the eldest of two daughters. She was baptized and worshipped as an active member of St. James A.M.E. Church until her marriage.

She grew up in “The Ville” of St. Louis during a time when the area served as a mecca for educational excellence, cultivation of the arts and political activism. In this regard, she observed her mother’s activism in the suffragette movement, reveled in close family friend W.C. Handy’s composition of music during salon at her parent’s home and benefitted from surrounding professionals. From a young age Louise played the piano at an accomplished level.

Louise received her primary education in the St. Louis Public School System and graduated from the historically renown Summer High School where she excelled academically and consistently remained on the Honor Roll. She participated in numerous activities including the Math Science Club and as a dancer in the “Y Circus”.

Venturing away from home to Jefferson City, MO *Louise* attended and graduated from Lincoln University where she received a B.S. in Elementary Education with honors. While attending "Lincoln" Louise pledged and became a member of AlphaKappa Alpha Sorority (Alpha Iota) while also excelling in campus dramatic and artistic organizations. She remained an active member of The Congress of Racial Equality (C.O.R.E.) and later encouraged her immediate family's participation as a "civil rights test family."

During her time at "Lincoln" she met Harvey S. McElroy, a "Lincoln" business administration and education major. They courted exclusively with dates on campus and dinners at the respective homes of their parents. Louise recalled fondly during their college years Harvey serenading her with Omega Psi Phi songsbeneath her dormitory window. They married on June 3, 1951 and remained lifelong partners for 60 years. Together they were confirmed and joined St.

Phillips Lutheran Church where they remained members as a family for over forty years.


Faced with ongoing segregation within the Missouri higher education system Louise and her younger sister Carleen went on to attend The University of Illinois- Champaign, where she received an M.A. in Education, magna cum laude, from the University Graduate College, May 1951. During her later college years and following graduation *Louise* and her sister participated in numerous civil rights demonstrations and concerted actions including lunch counter sit-ins where they recalled being harassed, spat upon andhaving their braids cut by racist oppositional onlookers.

Following graduate studies *Louise* began her teaching career in Springfield, Missouri. She subsequently taught primary education grades for the Webster Groves School system before obtaining her goal of a permanent teaching position with the St. Louis Public School System where she taught an array of grades as well as Special Education for over 42 years. In each step of her progression as an educator she was known by all her colleagues as an exemplary teacher who went to great extents to enhance her students learning experience and aptitude.

Often in instances where her students were economically challenged she personally provided needed assistance.


During the three years prior to retirement she requested the opportunity to teachprogressively from the sixth through eighth grade the same group of students pursuant to her desire to nurture and develop their academic skills. Many of those students went on to attend top colleges and obtain advance degrees.

Mrs. McElroy teaches 4th grade


