

Obituary



CHARLES D. HUGHES

Charles Douglas Hughes was born on October 18, 1937 to the union of John and Alta Wills Coates-Hughes in Starkville, Mississippi. Both parents, grandparents and one brother Andrew preceded him in death.

At a young age, Charles confessed a hope in Christ and was baptized at First Church of Christ Holiness. He attended regularly with his grandmother. It was there where he developed his sense of humor and love for people. While in high school, Charles worked at Mississippi State College. After graduating high school in 1956, he enrolled at Mary Holmes Junior College. He relocated to St. Louis after one semester.

Charles was drafted into the United States Army where he served as a Documentation Clerk for 2 years. He was honorably discharged from active duty in 1962 but continued to serve in the Army Reserves as Medic Tech and completed his service as a SP4.

Charles was united in Holy Matrimony to Stella Fleming on November 10, 1962. To this union one son was born, Craig Douglas. In 1964, Charles and Stella united with All Saints Episcopal Church. Charles joined the Men's Club and also became a member of the infamous "Biscuit Burners" cooking crew who assisted with church picnics. Charles became president of the Men's Club where he implemented the "Man of the Year" award. He reactivated the Men's Club after the merger of All Saints and Ascension but would later step down due to failing health.

Charles was employed at General Cable as a copper wire enameller for 8 years until they closed in 1974. He began his career with Monsanto in 1975 where he held several positions before becoming a Lab Assistant. Before retirement in 1994, he had received several awards for Job Safety Improvement.

Charles enjoyed gardening, fishing and cooking. But mostly enjoyed spending time with his family. He was the highlight of all the family functions and his 7 Up pound cake or cheese pie was highly requested. Charles never met a stranger and always had a joke to bring a smile on your face.

Charles departed this life on Sunday, May 19, 2024. He leaves to cherish his memories: his wife, Stella; son Craig(Eleanor); 4 grandchildren, Chantel(Isiah), Christopher(Shenice), Darryl and Deja, 7 great grandchildren, one brother-in-law, two sister-in-laws and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
